

KHAKIS VS. JEANS

Your guide to buying acceptable pants for the Lost Mountain Chorus Uniform



WHAT ARE “KHAKEI PANTS”?

- “Khaki” is often thought of as a color, but “Khakis “are a dressier style of pants, usually worn for dressier casual occasions, and are the "go to" for business casual attire.
- “Khakis” and “chinos” are both used to describe casual trousers made with a 100% cotton twill fabric. Technically, “khaki” is a color (light-brown drab), while “chinos” are a style of pant, so strictly speaking, khakis are brown-colored chinos. But of course, khakis are now also used to mean the type of pant itself, of any color.
- WE USE BEIGE FOR OUR UNIFORM.

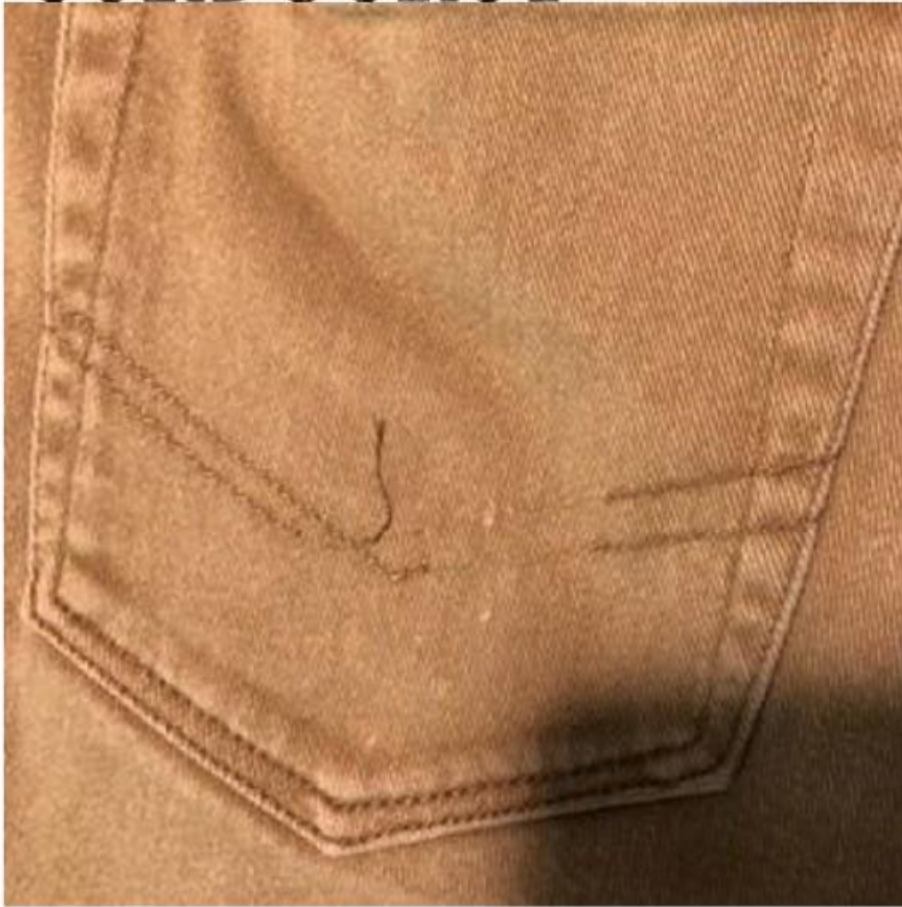


WHAT'S THE ADVANTAGE?

- Khakis look dressier.
- Khakis are every bit as easy to wear as jeans, and offer several benefits over denim: whereas jeans are stiff, tightly woven, heavy, and hot in the summer, khakis are soft, lightweight, comfortable, and cooler.
- Our uniform is low-cost, comfortable, and dressy enough for our age-group.

FRONT POCKETS

Khakis

- Khakis will have pocket that run along the side of the pant where opening doesn't show much if at all from a front view.
- Khakis don't use rivets to bolster seam junctions



Jeans

- Jeans have what are called "scoop" pockets. They are entered from above.
- all the pockets out front and highly visible
- Jeans tend to have rivets, although not always.
- Jeans tend to have a watch pocket



BACK POCKETS AND EXTRA SEAM

Khakis

- Khaki pockets are hidden
- Khakis don't use rivets to bolster seam junctions



Jeans

- all the pockets out front and highly visible
- Jeans tend to have rivets, although not always.
- Jeans have an EXTRA SEAM above the back pockets



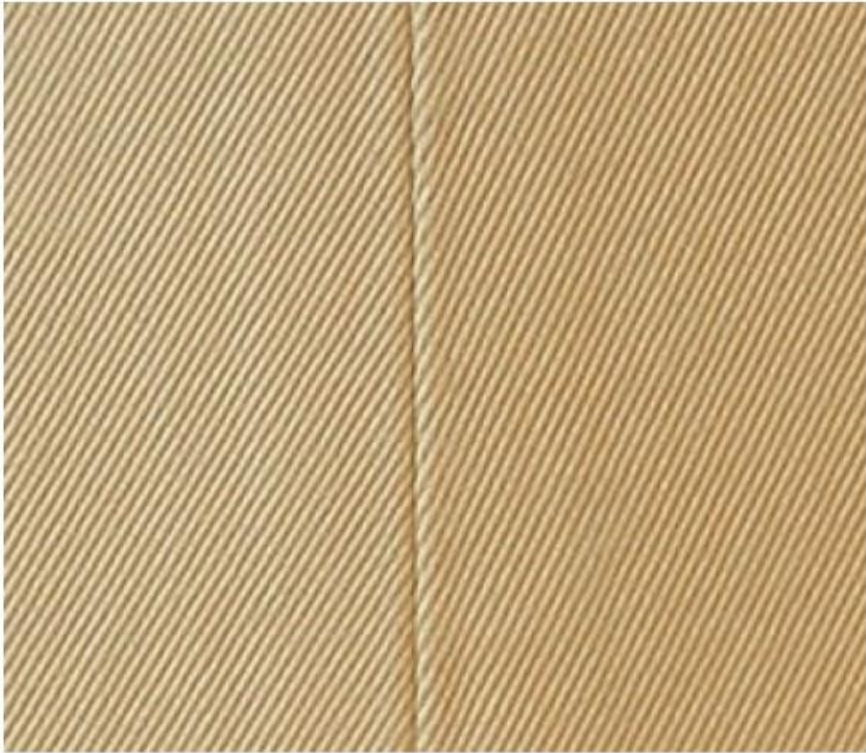
NO CARGO PANTS!

Khaki seams are hidden and plain



Jean seams (flat fell seam) have two rows of thread and protrude.
